are very glad to see members of the general public come and watch the sessions, we also hope that

performers themselves (and their families & friends) stay to support those in the classes after them,

and those performing on other days or in other sections. Festivals such as ours aspire to serve as an

interesting and educational experience for the audience too; we hope you find this so, but please let

us know if there is anything we can do to improve the event.

One important notice: whilst the Festival does everything it can to ensure the safety and comfort of everyone attending, we must emphasize that ultimate responsibility lies with each individual, or in the

case of children, with their parents, guardians, teachers or carers. The Festival cannot be held responsible

84-86 / Commended: "A convincing performance technically and artistically"

81-83 / Merit: "A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability"

78-80 / Moderate: "A performance showing development of technique and/or communication"

75-77 / Fair: "A performance limited in its communication"

Once again arrangements have been made to hold the winners concert and prize-giving ceremony in the Main Hall of the Winter Gardens, Margate, on Wednesday 31st March. We will ensure that the pace remains swift throughout the evening so that even the youngest prize-winners get a chance for their 15 seconds' fame. There will be a small entry charge but plenty of free parking on the lower promenade with stairs and a wheelchair ramp to the Main Hall. Soft drinks, ices and bar refreshments will be available. Come along and make this evening something special for all of the performers, and enjoyable for yourself and your family & friends.

The Festival is totally dependent on voluntary helpers, especially the Committee who work all the year round to ensure the smooth running of the various events: however we always need extra helpers, particularly in March when the Festival is taking place. Adjudicators' profiles

INSTRUMENTAL: Elizabeth Angel ARCM

Elizabeth Angel was born in 1937 and educated at Roedean. She entered the Royal College of Music in 1955 as an exhibitor and studied the 'cello and piano as joint first studies with Harvey Phillips and Hilda Klein. She achieved teaching diplomas in both instruments and a performance ARCM on the 'cello, and also won the first prize for 'cello. She continued her studies with Pierre Fournier in Geneva on a Countess of Munster award, and was chosen to represent Great Britain on an International Course in Santiago di Compostella. She also attended Master Classes in Switzerland taken by Pablo Casals, and appeared on television in a Paul Tortelier Master Class. From 1963, when she made a very successful debut at the Wigmore Hall, she freelanced in London, dividing her time between solo playing, chamber music, chamber orchestras and teaching. She has taught from 1962 at the Junior Department of the Royal College of Music and the Roehampton and West London Institutes. She also has a private practice of pupils ranging from 5 to 70! In 1966 she married Richard Bureau, violinist, and they formed the Bureau Piano Trio which has given many recitals at the Wigmore Hall and Purcell Room, including many first performances. She also plays in the Stamford Piano Quartet.

Miss Angel has been an Associated Board Examiner since 1986 and is also much in demand as a sympathetic and helpful adjudicator for the Federation. From 1993 she has toured the Far East for the Associated Board, including Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore and Malaysia.

DANCE: Chris Hocking MA

Chris trained at the Nesta Brooking School of Ballet and then went on to a very successful performing career in the West End, on tour and in regional repertory theatre. Shows include Fiddler On The Roof, Barnum, Chess, The King and I, Carousel, Chicago, Rocky Horror, Hot Stuff and On The Town. Numerous choreographic credits include Zelda, Blood Dive, Song & Dance, The Wiz, Oliver, Bugsy Malone, Cinderella, Robin Hood, and The Who's Tommy. For his own company he has devised, directed and produced Soho Story, My Lover Wears Boots, Seduction and Millennium Suite & Sour. He has worked on Gatecrashers (ITV), Smack The Pony and Welcome To Ibiza (Channel 4). He has recently choreographed the highly successful tour of Fiddler On The Roof starring Paul Nicholas and directed and choreographed Aladdin at the Lyceum Theatre Sheffield. He has co-written and choreographed a new musical called Club Tropicana which will open in the West End in the summer.

Chris is Head of Dance at The Arts Educational Schools London, and has taught at Elmhurst Ballet School and LAMDA. He is a British Festivals Federation and All England Dance Adjudicator.

SPEECH & DRAMA: Judy Buchanan, CSSD (Teachers' Dip.), L.Eng.Phon (Hons.)

Trained at the Central School of Speech and Drama, Judy has been teaching for many years. She has retired from school work to give full time to examining for LAMDA and Festival adjudicating, which have taken her to Africa, Sri Lanka, Hong Kong, Ireland and Singapore. She still does some private teaching to senior students. She has many years' experience of acting and directing with amateur companies – still indulging in either when time permits. She has enjoyed participating in Festivals since the age of 7 as competitor, then teacher.

PIANOFORTE: Dennis Lee BMus MMus

Dennis Lee was born in Penang, Malaysia. At age 14, he was awarded an Associated Board scholarship to the Royal College of Music, London. There he studied piano with Angus Morrison, winning the Tagore Gold Medal (for the most outstanding student of the year), and also gained a diploma in violin with Honours. Later, an Austrian Government scholarship took him to Vienna where under Josef Dichler he won the Stepanow Prize. Ilonka Deckers (Milan) was his most recent teacher. He has won prizes at the Royal Overseas League, Busoni, Sydney and Casagrande competitions. Concerts include appearances at the Royal Festival Hall, BBC Lunchtime Series, Wigmore Hall, Barbican Centre, Kennedy Center and National Gallery (Washington DC) as well as festivals like Montreux, Spoleto and Adelaide. He has performed with most of the BBC orchestras (including many live transmissions), the Halle, Slovak Chamber, Vienna, Adelaide, New Zealand, Singapore and Shanghai Symphony Orchestras, and the Warsaw and Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestras. His recording of Szymanowski attracted unanimously favourable reviews internationally, and more recently his complete cycle of the 32 Beethoven piano sonatas in France has been enthusiastically received.

He is greatly in demand as lecturer and festival adjudicator internationally, and has been an Associated Board examiner since 1977. He has also judged at the Finals of the Canadian Music Competitions and the London Piano Competition.

VOCAL & CHORAL: Judith Buckle

Judith Buckle was born in County Durham and studied at The Guildhall School of Music and Drama. She was a member of the BBC Singers and sang as a booth singer in the original West End production of Cats before joining the 'London Savoyards' on their QE2 world cruises. Judith has had a wide and varied career, ranging from early music to grand opera and has travelled extensively throughout Europe and the USA. Judith is well known as an opera singer having performed over 60 principal roles but regularly appears on the concert platform, specialising in English song. She appeared at the Three Choirs Festival in Hereford with the international pianist, Alan Cuckston, has made a recording of opera & song with the Peter Selwyn and a recording of Alan Rawsthorne's 'Scena Rustica' has just been released. Presently Judith is touring with Opera Box singing the title role in 'Carmen' and has been singing Third Lady in 'The Magic Flute' for the Classical Music Company. Judith also runs a busy teaching practice and teaches for the WEA in Canterbury.

VOCAL & CHORAL: Julia Dewhurst FTCL, ARCM, PGCA, Cert.Ed.

Julia Dewhurst enjoys a busy performing career encompassing opera, concert and recital repertoire. She has appeared with the Royal Opera, ENO, Kent Opera, Pavilion Opera, English Touring Opera, European Chamber Opera, London Opera Players, and the Garden Opera Company. She has broadcast for BBC TV and Radio and has sung in many of the country's leading concert venues, as well as having undertaken engagements in Europe, the Seychelles and Saudi Arabia, where she gave recitals and masterclasses under the auspices of the British Council.

In increasing demand as an adjudicator, she also has a thriving teaching practice, directs Voice Care workshops for teachers and is a visiting specialist in a West London primary school.
