SPEECH & DRAMA: STEPHEN OWEN BA(Ed) MA MEd PGDip(Ed) FRSA FESB FLCM LRAM LGSM(Perf) LTCL(Perf) LLCM(TD) LLAM (Hons) ATCL Cert Ed(Drama)

Stephen trained as a teacher of Drama, Speech and Movement at Trinity and All Saints' College, University of Leeds. After qualifying, he then studied for a number of years with Eliner Rutherford, gaining specialist teaching and performance diplomas in all aspects of Speech and Drama Studies. As well as being responsible for the drama curriculum in the schools where he worked, he also taught pupils of all ages and abilities privately, from complete beginners to Licentiate (RAM) and Fellowship (LCM) level. He became an examiner for The English Speaking Board and The Poetry Society and adjudicated at many Festivals throughout the country.

In 1985 he was appointed to the headship of a primary school in Derbyshire, an experience he thoroughly enjoyed for the next twenty-two years. It was during this period that he became a Religious Education inspector for the Roman Catholic diocese of Hallam. After retiring from school in 2007 he was appointed as an examiner for The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA) and also resumed his work as an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals.

When not examining or adjudicating, Stephen's leisure time consists of seeing as many plays and operas as possible and also teaching his young grandchildren to swim properly and ride bikes (without stabilisers).

VOCAL & CHORAL: NEIL JENKINS has been singing all his life, joining his first choir at the age of 6. He was a Chorister at Westminster Abbey, and then a Choral Scholar at King's College Cambridge. Whilst there he was the first tenor in the vocal group 'The Kings Singers', and sang in the first concerts given by John Eliot Gardiner's 'Monteverdi Choir'. He has been singing professionally for more than 50 years, having made his debut at London's South Bank centre in 1967.He is now an internationally renowned tenor, conductor and music editor and has recorded over 60 discs of opera, oratorio and song with many of the world's leading conductors and musicians, including Benjamin Britten, Leonard Bernstein, Alfred Deller, Riccardo Chailly, Sir Charles Mackerras, Sir Andrew Davies, Sir Roger Norrington, Sir Neville Marriner, Richard Hickox, Andrew Parrott, Kent Nagano and Hans Werner Henze.

In the 1970s he was appointed as an RCM singing professor by Sir David Willcocks, for whom he became a regular soloist with the London Bach Choir, especially as the Evangelist in the Bach Passions, performed annually at the Royal Festival Hall.

Neil has carved out a unique career, being equally at home as an Operatic, Oratorio and Recital singer, combining this with an increasingly important role as a musicologist. He has translated and edited Bach's major choral works for the New Novello Choral Edition, and has produced other editions for OUP, Kevin Mayhew and Barn End Press. For 12 years he ran his own international summer school for singers every August, and now gives a regular series of master classes, is a well-known Music Festival adjudicator, and sits on international singing juries. Neil has written the biography of the Handelian singer and first great English tenor, John Beard, and recently curated an exhibition about the singer at the Handel House Museum. His memoirs were published by Barn End Press in May 2021.

PIANOFORTE: KATHRYN MOSLEY was born in New Zealand, but made London her home after the award of a scholarship by the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music brought her to study at the Royal Academy of Music. Kathryn enjoys a number of collaborations with a variety of singers and instrumentalists. Recent performances have covered a wide range of repertoire, from early songs to newly commissioned works, including those by New Zealand composers, Prelude by Nigel Keay, and Lull and School of Velocity by Warwick Blair. She has broadcast on a number of occasions on Radio New Zealand. Kathryn's recording of the Sonata for Piano and Cello by Walter Macfarren with cellist Joseph Spooner on Dutton Epoch attracted warm critical attention, with her playing being singled out for its vivacity (Gramophone), vigour and conviction (International Record Review), and great sensitivity and skill (My Reviewer). In spring 2016, Kathryn toured New Zealand on Chamber Music New Zealand's Encompass scheme. In 2017, following the award of a doctorate for her thesis on cadenzas to Beethoven's piano concertos, Kathryn returned to New Zealand to premiere Czerny's arrangement of Beethoven's Piano Concerto op. 19 for string quartet and piano with members of the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra. Kathryn gives regular University lecture-recitals. Cultural interactions between literature and music are a particular interest. A 2014 concert at the New Zealand Embassy in Paris as part of the International conference organised by the Université Paris III–Sorbonne Nouvelle and the Katherine Mansfield Society was the beginning of an extended project exploring Mansfield's love of music and her association with the cellist Arnold Trowell. Kathryn gave a recital of works by Bach and spoke about Bach as pedagogue at a reading by the author and Nobel prize winner JM Coetzee as part of Coetzee & the Archive Conference at Senate House, London in 2017. In addition to performing Kathryn teaches piano in the Junior Department of the Royal Academy of Music, and travels widely in her role as an examiner for ABRSM

DANCE: CRAIG BARTLEY has recently returned from starring on Broadway as lead vocalist and show host/compare in 'SMILE' at the Town Hall Theatre, New York. Craig's career path is immense and has taken him from feature film, to stage and theatre, from drama series on tv to commercial endorsements. After 13 years performing in London's West End and then 7 years in the USA including musicals on Broadway and national theatre tours, Craig has seen and done the lot. His UK theatre credits include the original 42nd Street, Me & My Girl, Mack & Mabel, La Cage Aux Folles, Man of La Mancha, Song & Dance, Grease, Follies Royale. He has toured as backing vocalist with such legends as Gladys Knight, Tom Jones, Jennifer Holliday, Melba Moore, Tina Turner, Elton John and Tommy Tune in the US and also produced, directed, devised and choreographed many productions for cruise lines, hotels and corporate events worldwide. Craig has also played featured roles in feature films, soap operas, and performances for all the Royal family of the UK, Denmark, Spain, Monaco and Dubai. As another forte, Craig is a professional adjudicator & regularly lectures on dance and musical theatre and has opened his own Starquest Performers College in the SouthEast.

DANCE (middle weekend): JENNIFER HALEY ARAD, FNATD, PGCA trained in London from the age of five, with Tony Morgan, Maude Wells and Lettie Littlewood; three inspiring teachers. She completed in many dance festivals in London and the South East and as a teacher, entered pupils in local festivals. She has been a federation and All England Adjudicator for nearly thirty five years. She worked for over 20 years in the professional theatre, first as a dancer, then singer, actress, director and choreographer and latterly as a producer. With her husband Philip, they presented troupes of girls called The Jenny Set. Philip and Jennifer, Charles Haley Productions presented Pantomimes, Summer Shows, Tours, Plays and Musicals in London & all over the country. She also worked in variety with her own act of song, dance and comedy. Jennifer also had her own stage school for 20 years until 2004, teaching all genres of dance, singing and drama. Many of her pupils have gone on to work in the professional theatre. She was awarded the PGCA Dance Adjudication degree in 2000 and is. A life member of the RAD. Her two sons, Noël and Léon are both musicians and performers. Jennifer is an international adjudicator & has adjudicated in Northern Ireland, Gibraltar, Jersey, Romania & twice in Sri Lanka. She has adjudicated serval online festivals in 2020 both live and local.

INSTRUMENTAL: MALCOLM MCMILLAN ARCM. After being a founder member of Kent Youth Orchestra (Principal Clarinet) and an Exhibitioner at The Royal College of Music London, Malcolm went on to study with the great clarinettist Jack Brymer. He began playing professionally from 1968: in Cecil Barker's Orchestra in Broadstairs' Pavilion & in the Kent Sinfonia and Kent Opera, The Isle of Thanet S.O plus recitals at Nonington College & at local Arts Festivals. Works included the clarinet concertos by Mozart, Weber and Busoni. He combined playing with teaching for Kent Rural Music School & at Nonington College. He accepted a position in the Royal Ballet Sinfonia, Covent Garden in 1973, which took him throughout the UK and to Europe, China, South Africa and U.S.A. For several years in parallel to this, regular work with the Northern Sinfonia gave him the very special experience of playing chamber music on the concert platform. With these orchestras he was involved in recording well over fifty LPs and CDs. Other engagements include work with the CBSO, several West-End productions and the RSC etc. Some memorable performances were playing for the final appearance of Rudolph Nureyev with Margot Fonteyn at The Edinburgh International Festival; performing Romeo & Juliet in the open-air theatre, playing in the operas Don Giovanni and Le Nozze di Figaro in Paris; and being a regular member of the Dorset Opera orchestra. But the highlight of Malcolm's career must be playing the jews-harp in a live BBC Radio3 broadcast of a symphony by Charles Ives, where the two clarinettists had to stand up under spotlights and play their hearts out on strips of metal held between their teeth! After 40 years of playing in this demanding environment, Malcolm decided to retire in 2013 -to spend more time at home and pursue his many other interests. He now enjoys playing with local orchestras and ensembles and can be spotted playing tenor sax in the Goodwin Sounds big band. Despite the roving nature of his work Malcolm has always lived locally.

SPEECH AND DRAMA SECTION RULES

Please remember to adhere to the time limits, and please check the general rules.

1. Classes S70 – S111 (inclusive) must be performed from memory.

2. Choral Speech: It is permissible for groups to have one or more soloists. Movement is allowed so long as it enhances the speech.

3. Mime: Sound effects and music may be used. No stage props allowed.

4. Drama: Simple costumes & bona fide stage props may be used and should conform to safety standards

5. Bible Reading: Any version may be used with an additional copy for the Adjudicator

6. Public Speaking: Audio/visual aids may be used where appropriate. Classes S134 and S135 should be in the form of an informal talk, while performers in Classes S132 and S133 should regard their work as a speech to an audience. Notes may be used for reference.

7. The Adjudicator and/or Convenor will bring to a halt and disqualify any Speech and Drama item which by reason of its unsuitability for a young audience seems likely to give offence or cause embarrassment.

8. Group Improvisation: Each group is expected to prepare its presentation independently of the teachers

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VOCAL & CHORAL SECTION RULES

1. 'Own Choice' items should be limited to 3 minutes for the Juniors, 4 minutes for the Adults and Ensemble choices (unless otherwise stated) and titles and composers of these should be sent to the Vocal Convenor by 1st February 2020. An original copy (not photocopy) should be provided for the Adjudicator and brought on the day of the Festival Section. All the set music should be easily available, but if there is any difficulty in obtaining copies please contact the Vocal Convenor. The Adjudicator will already have a copy of set pieces

2. Performers are asked to provide their own accompanists. For advice and information with regard the availability of accompanists please contact the Vocal Convenor. Taped backing or backing CDs are allowed as long as an original copy of the sheet music is available for the adjudicator. These backings must be within the stated time limit.

3. Performers who work during the day should state on their form when they would genuinely be unavailable. Whilst every effort will be made to avoid time-tabling at what might seem awkward times it should be appreciated that this cannot be guaranteed.


4. An 'Art Song' is a Secular (non-Sacred) song, written for the voice and piano, and is often a setting of text. It does not include popular songs or material from the shows.

If younger children want to sing a 'non-Art Song', they should enter the other categories for Under 13s / Under 16s. Teachers are respectfully requested to guide their pupils in selecting 'Own Choice' items. Material should be suitable for the age and level of voice development. Teachers should also ensure that their song is suitable for the class being entered. For advice on the suitability of material please contact the Vocal Convenor.

5. The choice of music and general presentation will be reflected in the marking.

6. In Folk, Light Opera and Modern Style classes personal interpretation will be allowed where appropriate and the candidate will not be expected to adhere strictly to the written score.

7. Young accompanists (i.e. not professionals) who are accompanying singers in any of the Vocal or Choral classes are eligible for the Thelma Springford Award. Young accompanists wishing to be considered should give their name to the Convenor

- 3. Entries are timed from the first note of music.

4. The committee reserves the right to commence any class up to 30 minutes before the appointed time.

5. The choice of music and presentation will be reflected in the marking.

6. Performers should provide their own music clearly marked and ready to play (one CD for each dance). If not it could reflect in your marks.

7. No re-dance for 11 years & over unless the problems are beyond the performer's control.

8. No pointe work under the age of 13.

9. All props should be non-breakable and conform to safety standards.

10. All music must be handed in at least two sections before you are due to perform; if not it could lead to you being withdrawn.

11. Song and Dance must have no chanting or vocals of any kind in the music. If there is you will not be marked.

12. Tap music must not have any sound effects that sound the same as tapping, it will result in you not being marked.

SECTION RULES (See also the General Rules)

1. All classes are 'Own Choice' unless otherwise marked. Performers must provide the Adjudicator with a copy of 'Own Choice' music (see General Rules 9-11). 2. In 'Own Choice' Grade classes, the pieces chosen may be from either the Associated Board or Trinity syllabus from any year, past or present. Participants may only enter ONE class in each of these groups.

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INSTRUMENTAL

GENERAL RULES

1. The festival is open to performers of all ages, and from all locations.

2. Unless otherwise specified, performers in all classes must be amateurs (an amateur is considered to be one who does not derive the main part of their income from that section of the art in which they are proposing to enter the Festival NOR is receiving full-time professional training in that subject). This does not apply to accompanists or conductors.

3. A performer must be the specified age on 1st March in the year of the Festival. In age specific classes the age of all performers under 21 must be noted on the Entry Form in the appropriate column. Some classes are reserved for Senior Citizens, but senior citizens are also welcome to enter any other adult class.

4. Impersonation will debar all participants in the fraud from taking part in this & future Festivals.

5. All performers in choirs or other groups must be bona fide members.

6. Entries must be made by the closing date, 1st December. Late entries will only be considered if agreed in advance with the relevant Convenor(s) and may incur an extra charge.

7. No late entries or alterations will be allowed after the programme has gone to press, except where a mistake has been made by the Festival. ALL alterations must be notified to the relevant convenor by 1st December.

8. The Committee reserves the right to combine or cancel any class due to insufficient entries.

9. A performer may perform a piece once only in this year's Festival and may not include a set piece in an 'Own Choice' selection.

10. 'Own Choice' titles should be stated on the Entry Form and should be limited to 3 minutes unless otherwise stated. Late selections must be notified to the convenor no later than two weeks prior to the commencement of the section.

11. Performers must provide a copy of 'Own Choice' items for the adjudicator

12. Payment of Performing Rights Fees is the responsibility of each performer.

13. Any good edition of set pieces will be accepted.

14. The convenor reserves the right to commence any class up to 30 minutes before the appointed time.

15. Entries that exceed the stated time limit will be penalised and the adjudicator reserves the right to stop a performance that is overrunning.

16. Entrants in the Instrumental section must bring their own instruments (including drum kits etc.) unless cleared in advance with the Section Convenor.

17. Performers are respectfully asked to dress as befits the occasion.

18. NO PHOTOGRAPHY, SOUND or VIDEO RECORDING by ANY means is allowed; not only can they distract performers and infringe copyright law, but, most importantly, any recording goes against our child protection policy. Mobile phones 19. NO SMOKING is allowed inside any of the Festival venues during the Festival.

20. Those in the audience are expected to behave appropriately, e.g. not entering or leaving the hall while a performance or adjudication is in progress and above all remaining silent while others perform and when the adjudicator or stewards speak. Anyone deemed not to be behaving appropriately will be asked to leave; no refund will be given in this case

21. Parents/guardians are responsible at all times for the welfare of the children/young people in their charge. The Festival does not hold itself responsible for any injury sustained by any competitor or member of the public whilst on the Festival premises.

22. All trophies awarded at the 2020 Festival must be returned to the **relevant convenor by 1st March 2022**. Similarly, all trophies awarded at this year's (2022) Festival must be returned by **1st March 2023**. Failure to do so will result in the winner being billed for the trophy and all necessary re-engraving. Those wishing to have their names engraved on trophies they have won must arrange this by themselves.

23. Any complaints relating to the competition should be sent to the Secretary in writing enclosing a S.A.E. Any queries regarding a section should be directed to its Convenor.

24. The decision of the Adjudicator is final. He/she shall have the power to withhold any certificate if, in his/her opinion no performer reaches a sufficiently high standard. Awards are also at the Adjudicator's discretion and may not necessarily reflect the highest mark in a class or section.

25. Infringement of any of our rules might result in a competitor and/or all from that teacher/school being banned entry in ensuing classes and future festivals.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Thanet Music and Drama Festival ("TMDF") aims to provide a safe and caring environment for all its participants, and to conform to current child protection legislation. The following constitutes TMDF's child protection policy:

1. Purpose

The purpose of the festival is to advance the education of the public in the performing arts, by holding an annual competitive festival and presenting public performances.

2. Environment

It is our policy under the Protection of Children Act 1999 to involve parents/guardians/carers & teachers in partnership with us to ensure a safe environment at the festival, insofar as it is reasonably practicable.

3. Application

This policy relates both to children under the age of 18 and to those vulnerable adults who are identified to the organizers prior to their arrival at the festival. The festival recognizes the needs of children who are disabled or from ethnic minorities, and will seek to meet any specific needs notified to the festival in advance by parents/guardians/carers or teachers.

4. Personnel

TMDF is run entirely by volunteers, all of whom have independent references and are briefed about the terms of this policy. Should any problem arise regarding the terms of this policy, it should be notified to a TMDF Committee member, identifiable by badge, who will take appropriate action in a discreet manner.

5. Preparation

All participants in this festival will be expected to have seen this policy. In accordance with this policy, it is essential that parents/guardians/carers not personally attending the festival be satisfied that their children etc. are accompanied and adequately supervised by responsible adults acting on their behalf; TMDF staff will not undertake this rôle. With group entries, the group leader must ensure that all parents/ guardians/carers are aware of this policy. Each person signing the entry form thereby takes full responsibility for those entered by the form.

6. Changing areas

It is emphasized that the article above applies equally to changing areas, i.e. that responsibility remains with the supervising adult in each case. Property left unattended is also not the responsibility of TMDF.

7. Photography

No photography (including video photography) is permitted at the festival, other than by accredited members of the press. Such photography will always take place in a public place. Any parent/guardian/ carer not wishing the individual(s) in their care to be photographed must notify the photographer in good time.

8. Legislation supporting this policy

The Children Act 1989, The Police Act 1997, The Data Protection Act 1998, The Human Rights Act 1998, The Protection of Children Act 1999, The Criminal Justice & Court Services Act 2000.

9. Review

The TMDF Committee will review this policy at regular intervals, consulting *the British & International Federation of Festivals* for support and advice on best practice. For any queries relating to this document please contact the Secretary.
