Adjudicators' Profiles

SPEECH & DRAMA: Peter Dayson

Peter has been a Producer/Director/Actor/Writer for over 50 years. He started his career in repertory and his many roles include Malcolm in '**MACBETH'**, Tom in '**GLASS MENAGERIE'** and Jack in '**CHARLEY'S AUNT'**, Danny in '**GREASE**' Berger in '**HAIR'**, & Judas/John the Baptist in '**GODSPELL** and has appeared in '**SORRY'**, '**BLAKES SEVEN'**, '**DR WHO**,' etc on TV.

As a director Peter has over 70 Productions to his credit, including the awardwinning productions of 'GORILLA IN THE ROSES' and 'GOLDILOCKS AND THE THREE BEARS'.

He was also responsible for **DISNEY's** first Pantomime for Television as a Writer and Executive Producer.

In 2007 he produced and directed '**GODSPELL**' at Her Majesty's Theatre, 2008 **'HAIR'** at 'The London Palladium', 2009 '**OH WHAT A LOVELY WAR'** at 'The Theatre Royal, Drury Lane' and in 2010 he produced, directed and wrote a new Beatles Musical '**STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOR EVER**' which played at 'The London Palladium'.

Peter has his own production company 'SYNERGY STREET PRODUCTIONS' and recently produced a production of 'SING' which played to capacity audiences and high critical acclaim. He has also just finished producing and compering 'AN EVENING WITH HELEN SHARMAN' at Lincoln Cathedral and has just written, directed and produced a new musical at Hazlewood Castle in Leeds, called 'HAZLEWOOD-LEGENDS OF THE CASTLE' which ran to high critical acclaim. Last year he is directed 'SNOW WHITE' in Leeds starring Jez Edwards and 'SNOW WHITE' in Birmingham starring Lee Latchford-Evans from 'Steps' and this year 'SLEEPING BEAUTY in Leeds and 'BEAUTY and the BEAST' in Birmingham. Peter is also a British and International adjudicator for the the British Federation of Adjudicators (BIFF) and has just finished the festivals in Hong Kong, Sri Lanka and Canada, Purley, Isle of Man, Derby, Chichester, Colsterworth and Cumbria. He is also working on a new concept 'rap' to introduce a new student cohort to Festivals. A few years ago, Peter ran the London Marathon, (second time) for Arthritis Research UK and in his spare time enjoys spending time with his wife Anna and three children Lucy 23, Harry 21 and Jack 16 and Benji (our dog) 3, loves egg and chips and is a massive Spurs fan.

PIANOFORTE: Nancy Litten LRAM (piano), FLCM (keyboard) LRAM (violin), ATCL (voice), Prof Cert RAM, Cert Ed (Exeter), FISM, FRSA Nancy won an Arts Council award to study with Julius Isserlis in London at thirteen, and an open piano scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music at sixteen, winning prizes during her studies there. She has performed as a pianist in solo, , orchestral and chamber music, and as a piano accompanist, being well known in Kent. She is an all-round musician, also having been a freelance orchestral violinist and leader of a string quartet. Tutoring has formed a large part of her life, from beginners through to diploma level; she has taught privately and in many different types of school and on courses and masterclasses. She is an ABRSM examiner, an adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals (serving on the Adjudicators' Council for seven years including as Vice Chair) and organised EPTA (European Piano Teachers' Association) UK's Kent region for 13 years. Last year one of her pupils won the top prize in the post grade 8 category of EPTA's national piano competition.

Alfred Music UK has published a range of her books: *Keyed Up* tutors for electronic keyboard, *Playing with Colour* tutors for violin, *Choral and Vocal Warm-ups for Pianists, Choral and Vocal Sight Singing with Keyboard Harmony,* and *Rounds with Accompaniment*. Her piano trio (piano, violin and cello) arrangements of famous piano pieces are *Classical Vienna, Romantic Vienna,* and *Baroque London*. Her pieces and arrangements can be found in the Trinity College London and ABRSM syllabuses (including *The Sad Ghost* at piano grade 3). EVC Music has published a book of her original piano pieces (grades 3-5) called *Piano Postcards* and Clifton Edition her album of minimalist piano pieces (grades 6-8) called *These Sweet Days*.

VOCAL & CHORAL: Gary Sieling was born in Bedfordshire and educated at Dunstable Grammar School. He read for his BMus degree at the University of London, Goldsmiths' College and while a student played for the debut of the London Cantata Choir with whom he is still associated. He studied organ with Peter Moorse, Nicholas Danby at the Royal College of Music, Dr Peter le Huray at St Catherine's College Cambridge, and Jane Parker-Smith. He was awarded FRCO in 1981 and MA in Performance from Anglia Ruskin University in 1997, studying organ with Nicholas Kynaston at Caius College Cambridge. He was organist of Dunstable Priory and then Assistant Master of Music at Peterborough Cathedral. During his time there he was Conductor of the Peterborough Philharmonic Society, Director of the St Peter's Singers, and Founder and Associate Conductor of the City of Peterborough Symphony Orchestra. He also taught organ and piano at Oundle and Stamford Schools. He played for the Cathedral Choir on two tours of America in addition to regular TV and radio broadcasts and recordings.

After 6 years in London as Director of Music at Bromley Parish Church and All Saints Blackheath, Gary is now living in Rushden and, as a Bedfordshire Freemason, has been appointed Provincial Grand Organist for Bedfordshire.

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He is also President of the Beds and Herts Organists Association, founder and director of the chamber choir 'FineChants' which has recently sung at Brussels, Cologne and St Paul's Cathedrals. He works as a freelance organist, harpsichordist, conductor, adjudicator, and examiner for the Royal College of Organists. He spent the summers of 2009 and 2011 as the Music Adjudicator to the Sri Lanka Performing Arts Festival. For the first two terms of 2024, he was Chapel Organist of Oakham School. His CD recordings include one for Priory Records from Chelmsford Cathedral featuring the major organ works of Stanley Vann, sometime organist of Peterborough Cathedral, and the 'Kenneth Leighton Memorial Album' which Gary compiled and published. Gary has also recorded a CD of harpsichord and organ music at Bromley Parish Church. Organ concert venues in this country include St Paul's, Canterbury and Westminster Cathedrals, King's College Cambridge and Westminster Abbey. He has made many international concert tours visiting Denmark, Germany, Italy, USA and Australia.

Gary likes to relax by travelling, exploring old churches, and messing about on the English waterways on his narrowboat.

INSTRUMENTAL: John Harper's formal music training began when, after hearing the 14-year-old busking self-taught on a school piano in a charity concert, one of his teachers absolutely insisted that he took piano lessons, even if it meant the teacher paying for them himself! Four years followed at London's Royal College of Music, from which he graduated, having gained diplomas for piano playing, piano accompaniment (at the Royal Academy of Music) and oboe playing (at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama). For his performance in the latter he was awarded the Guildhall Silver Medal. For two years he taught in the RCM Junior Department and was official accompanist for all auditions. After thirty-five years in classrooms teaching Music, English Language/Literature and Drama, he left the education profession, where he was a Housemaster and latterly Senior Master at St Lawrence College, Ramsgate, to adjudicate at music festivals (as diverse as Thanet and Hong Kong) and work for Trinity College London as a Music Examiner; in this capacity he has had the privilege of travelling widely through five continents prior to his second (and final) retirement in 2021. In the last few years he has returned to singing (at St Andrew's Church in Deal and in the Thanet Chamber Choir) and has enjoyed arranging Coffee Concerts as well as the challenges of accompanying Deal Festival masterclasses, most recently with Steven Isserlis and Jess Gillam.

DANCE: JILL BALDOCK

Jill is a passionate adjudicator for The British & International Federation of Festivals and All England Dance.

She trained at The Hylton Bromley School on Merseyside, where she gained several scholarships from the IDTA. She also trained at The Royal Academy of Dance and The Place. During her training Jill was awarded 7 solo gold medals in the Sunshine Finals, she was also presented with The Modern, The National, The Sunshine Trophies, plus an invitation to the Beryl Grey Awards. Her first professional career commenced with the 'Top of The Pops' dance group 'The Go-Jos', she then went on to work in numerous TV, Film, Cabaret and West End Shows.

Shows include "Kiss Me Kate", "Carousel", "The King and I", "Oklahoma", "Fiddler On The Roof", "Song of Norway" etc.

Jill become an international choreographer, director and producer of theatre, cabaret and cruise shows.

She then diverted her career into the music business, with her own successful recording/publishing company. Producing for EMI, Virgin and Carlton Records. The company achieved a Number 1 hit single, plus The Ivor Novello Award.

Recording artistes include Shirley Bassey, Anthony Newley, Ruthie Henshall, Marti Webb, Toyah Wilcox, London Community Gospel Choir and many, many more! She had the honour of producing the official recording for the Queen Mothers 100th Birthday Celebrations.

Jill returned to her love of teaching and worked for the Italia Conti School, the Surrey and Derbyshire Arts Councils, at the same times as running her own theatre school.

More recently Jill has been encouraging musicians from The Royal Academy, assisting with their presentation and performance skills, which has led them towards recording contracts and a variety of TV and Radio gigs.

Jill's colourful career has been about her love of music and dance.

SPEECH AND DRAMA SECTION RULES

Please remember to adhere to the time limits, and please check the general rules.

1. Classes S70 – S111 (inclusive) must be performed from memory.

2. Choral Speech: It is permissible for groups to have one or more soloists. Movement is allowed so long as it enhances the speech.

3. Mime: Sound effects and music may be used. No stage props allowed.

4. Drama: Simple costumes & bona fide stage props may be used and should conform to safety standards

5. Bible Reading: Any version may be used with an additional copy for the Adjudicator

6. Public Speaking: Audio/visual aids may be used where appropriate. Classes S134 and S135 should be in the form of an informal talk, while performers in Classes S132 and S133 should regard their work as a speech to an audience. Notes may be used for reference.

7. The Adjudicator and/or Convenor will bring to a halt and disqualify any Speech and Drama item which by reason of its unsuitability for a young audience seems likely to give offence or cause embarrassment.

8. Group Improvisation: Each group is expected to prepare its presentation independently of the teachers and it should be original and spontaneous.

9. Drama may include original scripts, dramatised poems or Bible scenes, published or unpublished, but stand-alone monologues/duologues will be adjudicated as being less of a challenge than those from plays.

10. The performers' own choice pieces will be taken into account in the marking and must present a sufficient challenge in thought, technique and duration.

1. 'Own Choice' items should be limited to 3 minutes for the Juniors, 4 minutes for the Adults and Ensemble choices (unless otherwise stated) & titles & composers of these should be sent to the Vocal Convenor by 1st Feb. An original copy (not photocopy) should be provided for the Adjudicator and brought on the day of the Festival Section. All the set music should be easily available, but if there is any difficulty in obtaining copies please contact the Vocal Convenor. The Adjudicator will already have a copy of set pieces

2. Performers are asked to provide their own accompanists. For advice and information with regard the availability of accompanists please contact the Vocal Convenor. Taped backing or backing CDs are allowed as long as an original copy of the sheet music is available for the adjudicator. These backings must be within the stated time limit.

3. An 'Art Song' is a Secular (non-Sacred) song, written for the voice and piano, and is often a setting of text. It does not include popular songs or material from the shows.

If younger children want to sing a 'non-Art Song', they should enter the other categories for Under 13s / Under 16s. Teachers are respectfully requested to guide their pupils in selecting 'Own Choice' items. Material should be suitable for the age and level of voice development. Teachers should also ensure that their song is suitable for the class being entered. For advice on the suitability of material please contact the Vocal Convenor.

4.. The choice of music and general presentation will be reflected in the marking.

5. In Folk, Light Opera and Modern Style classes personal interpretation will be allowed where appropriate and the candidate will not be expected to adhere strictly to the written score.

6. Young accompanists (i.e. not professionals) who are accompanying singers in any of the Vocal or Choral classes are eligible for the Thelma Springford Award. Young accompanists wishing to be considered should give their name to the Convenor before the start of the class or classes for which they are accompanying so that the adjudicator can be advised.

7. The set pieces for both Junior and Adult classes may be sung in any appropriate key, unless otherwise specified.

DANCE

DANCE SECTION RULES

1. Duets and groups are governed by the age of the oldest performer

2. Duets & trios: dancers may perform three times in each class with different partners.

3. Entries are timed from the first note of music.

4. The committee reserves the right to commence any class up to 30 minutes before the appointed time.

5. The choice of music and presentation will be reflected in the marking.

6. Performers should provide their own music clearly marked and ready to play (one CD for each dance). If not it could reflect in your marks.

7. No re-dance for 11 years & over unless the problems are beyond the performer's control.

8. No pointe work under the age of 13.

9. All props should be non-breakable and conform to safety standards.

10. All music must be handed in at least two sections before you are due to perform; if not it could lead to you being withdrawn.

11. Song and Dance must have no chanting or vocals of any kind in the music. If there is you will not be marked.

12. Tap music must not have any sound effects that sound the same as tapping, it will result in you not being marked.

13. The adjudicator's decision is final.

GENERAL RULES

1. The festival is open to performers of all ages, and from all locations.

2. Unless otherwise specified, performers in all classes must be amateurs (an amateur is considered to be one who does not derive the main part of their income from that section of the art in which they are proposing to enter the Festival NOR is receiving full-time professional training in that subject). This does not apply to accompanists or conductors.

3. A performer must be the specified age on 1st March in the year of the Festival. In age specific classes the age of all performers under 21 must be noted on the Entry Form in the appropriate column. Some classes are reserved for Senior Citizens, but senior citizens are also welcome to enter any other adult class.

4. Impersonation will debar all participants in the fraud from taking part in this & future Festivals.

5. All performers in choirs or other groups must be bona fide members.

6. Entries must be made by the closing date, 1st December. Late entries will only be considered if agreed in advance with the relevant Convenor(s) and may incur an extra charge.

7. No late entries or alterations will be allowed after the programme has gone to press, except where a mistake has been made by the Festival. ALL alterations must be notified to the relevant convenor by 1st December.

8. The Committee reserves the right to combine or cancel any class due to insufficient entries.

9. A performer may perform a piece once only in this year's Festival and may not include a set piece in an 'Own Choice' selection.

10. 'Own Choice' titles should be stated on the Entry Form and should be limited to 3^{51} minutes unless otherwise stated. Late selections must be notified to the convenor no later than two weeks prior to the commencement of the section.

11. Performers must provide a copy of 'Own Choice' items for the adjudicator

12. Payment of Performing Rights Fees is the responsibility of each performer.

13. Any good edition of set pieces will be accepted.

14. The convenor reserves the right to commence any class up to 30 minutes before the appointed time.

15. Entries that exceed the stated time limit will be penalised and the adjudicator reserves the right to stop a performance that is overrunning.

16. Entrants in the Instrumental section must bring their own instruments (including drum kits etc.) unless cleared in advance with the Section Convenor.

17. Performers are respectfully asked to dress as befits the occasion.

18. NO PHOTOGRAPHY, SOUND or VIDEO RECORDING by ANY means is allowed; not only can they distract performers and infringe copyright law, but, most importantly, any recording goes against our child protection policy. Mobile phones must be switched off.

19. NO SMOKING is allowed inside any of the Festival venues during the Festival.

20. Those in the audience are expected to behave appropriately, e.g. not entering or leaving the hall while a performance or adjudication is in progress and above all remaining silent while others perform and when the adjudicator or stewards speak. Anyone deemed not to be behaving appropriately will be asked to leave; no refund will be given in this case

21. Parents/guardians are responsible at all times for the welfare of the children/young people in their charge. The Festival does not hold itself responsible for any injury sustained by any competitor or member of the public whilst on the Festival premises.

22. All trophies awarded at the 2024 Festival must be returned to the relevant convenor by 1st March 2025. Similarly, all trophies awarded at this year's (2025) Festival must be returned by 1st March 2026. Failure to do so will result in the winner being billed for the trophy and all necessary re-engraving. Those wishing to have their names engraved on trophies they have won must arrange this by themselves.

23. Any complaints relating to the competition should be sent to the Secretary in writing enclosing a S.A.E. Any gueries regarding a section should be directed to its Convenor.

24. The decision of the Adjudicator is final. He/she shall have the power to withhold any certificate if, in his/her opinion no performer reaches a sufficiently high standard. Awards are also at the Adjudicator's discretion and may not necessarily reflect the highest mark in a class or section.

25. Infringement of any of our rules might result in a competitor and/or all from that teacher/school being banned entry in ensuing classes and future festivals.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Thanet Music and Drama Festival ("TMDF") aims to provide a safe and caring environment for all its participants, and to conform to current child protection legislation. The following constitutes TMDF's child protection policy:

1. Purpose

The purpose of the festival is to advance the education of the public in the performing arts, by holding an annual competitive festival and presenting public performances.

2. Environment

It is our policy under the Protection of Children Act 1999 to involve parents/guardians/carers & teachers in partnership with us to ensure a safe environment at the festival, insofar as it is reasonably practicable.

3. Application

This policy relates both to children under the age of 18 and to those vulnerable adults who are identified to the organizers prior to their arrival at the festival. The festival recognizes the needs of children who are disabled or from ethnic minorities, and will seek to meet any specific needs notified to the festival in advance by parents/guardians/carers or teachers.

4. Personnel

TMDF is run entirely by volunteers, all of whom have independent references and are briefed about the terms of this policy. Should any problem arise regarding the terms of this policy, it should be notified to a TMDF Committee member, identifiable by badge, who will take appropriate action in a discrete manner.

5. Preparation

All participants in this festival will be expected to have seen this policy. In accordance with this policy, it is essential that parents/guardians/carers not personally attending the festival be satisfied that their children etc. are accompanied and adequately supervised by responsible adults acting on their behalf; TMDF staff will not undertake this rôle. With group entries, the group leader must ensure that all parents/ guardians/carers are aware of this policy. Each person signing the entry form thereby takes full responsibility for those entered by the form.

6. Changing areas

It is emphasized that the article above applies equally to changing areas, ie. that responsibility remains with the supervising adult in each case. Property left unattended is also not the responsibility of TMDF.

7. Photography

No photography (including video photography) is permitted at the festival, other than by accredited members of the press. Such photography will always take place in a public place. Any parent/guardian/ carer not wishing the individual(s) in their care to be photographed must notify the photographer in good time.

8. Legislation supporting this policy

The Children Act 1989, The Police Act 1997, The Data Protection Act 1998, The Human Rights Act 1998, The Protection of Children Act 1999, The Criminal Justice & Court Services Act 2000.

9. Review

The TMDF Committee will review this policy at regular intervals, consulting *the British & International Federation of Festivals* for support and advice on best practice. For any queries relating to this document please contact the Secretary.
